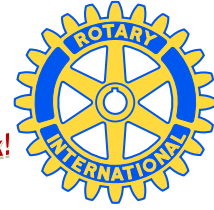

At Tuesday's Meeting... Youth Ag Day at the Solano County Fair



Youth Ag Day at the Solano County Fairgrounds An Annual Adventure for Solano 3rd Graders

Stephen Pierce is the General Manager (GM) of the Solano County Fairgrounds — a 150 acre piece of property at the intersection of Interstate 80 and Highway 37. Mr. Pierce assumed the role of General Manager on December 1, 2014, but has been part of the Solano County community since the Air Force dropped him off here 23 years ago. As GM of the Solano Fairgrounds, Stephen hopes to be part of diversifying the local economy as he builds the Fair of the Future and the development of the property as part of the Solano360 project.

The Fairgrounds is home to a bevy of year-round activities such as concerts, dog shows & annually hosts the Solano County Fair in summer and Youth Ag Day on March 17. The annual Youth Ag Day is a collaborative effort of the Solano County Fair and agricultural related businesses, organizations, farmers, ranchers and other individuals to encourage Solano County third graders to experience agriculture first-hand. This fun and educational event is free to all third grade classes in Solano County and features a wide variety of rotational learning stations and displays. Activities are designed to give children the opportunity to learn about food and fiber production from new perspectives, with a particular emphasis on the agricultural wealth of Solano County. Children participate in hands-on displays and educational presentations as well as an optional pre-event classroom project to enhance the field trip learning experience.

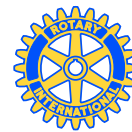

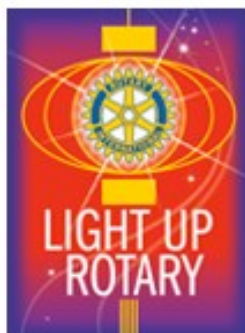
