Tim Grayson — California State Assembly

Tim Grayson is an American politician serving in the California State Assembly. He is a Democrat representing the 14th Assembly District, encompassing parts of the East Bay and the North Bay. Prior to being elected to the Assembly, he was a member of the Concord City Council. As our speaker today, Tim

started by thanking our club for the many things that we do to serve our community.

Tim spent some time talking about "inside Sacramento." Apparently, over 3500 new bills have been introduced this year. Many are regulatory in nature. Tim said that one of his tasks was to make sure many of the bills get waysided — so they don't get in the way off growing California's economy. He talked about how 7.9 million more dollars was expected in California's budget than originally anticipated, and how 5.9 million had been set aside for a California's future rainy day fund. He talked about budget — there are various ways to save: actually save money, invest money, or pay down debt. One of his tasks is to determine the best way to help California's future well being. He talked about paying down the CalSTRS unfunded liability. He spoke of AB2410 to reduce LLC fees to small businesses. He mentioned AB1904, and AB2771, of which is a joint author — to have a 7 billion dollar bond

of which 1 million dollars would go to enhance UC and CalState campuses, including capital improvements. The other 6 million dollar would be to create three new campuses.

Assemblyman Grayson also talked about Governor Brown and that he feels that Governor Brown wants to go out with a legacy, which could be the completion of the CA high speed rail system. If the project were to stop now, it would be huge waste of money and time. We are almost at the "point of no return" in the creation of the high speed rail system. Mr Grayson also talked about Cap & Trade, AB1905, and shared his policy and philosophy.
